

## Accessory Guidelines: All Logic and Rhetoric Students

<b>Girls Hair</b>	<p>Hair must be combed. It should be neat and tidy, and styled off of the face and out of the eyes in a manner that is not distracting to oneself or others.</p> <p>Hair accessories may include: clips, ponytail holders, hair bands, and bows in solid navy, white, black, brown, or red.</p> <p>No ostentatious colors, animal ears, tiaras, etc.</p> <p>No un-natural hair dyes (blue hair, pink extensions, etc.)</p>
<b>Boys Hair</b>	<p>Must be cut neatly and conservatively so as not to hang in the eyes and be a distraction to oneself and others. No ostentatious styles such as pony tails, man buns, mullets, mohawks, etc.</p> <p>No un-natural hair dyes (blue hair, pink extensions, etc.)</p>
<b>Hats</b>	<p>Beanie style hats for warmth may be worn outside only</p> <p><b><i>Baseball caps and other hats may not be brought to school or worn on campus</i></b></p>
<b>Jewelry and Makeup</b>	<p>Girls may wear conservative jewelry and light makeup.</p> <p>Boys may wear a conservative necklace and ring (no earrings).</p>
<b>Undershorts Recommended</b>	<p>It is recommended that girls wear bike shorts under dresses and skirts that do not already have built-in shorts.</p>
<b>Rain or Snow Boots</b>	<p>Rain or snow boots may be worn <i>to</i> the classroom, but not <i>in</i> the classroom.</p> <p><i>Students will need to bring their regular shoes and swap before class.</i></p>
<b>Coats and Jackets</b>	<p>Students may wear a zip up coat or jacket to school and outside on breaks.</p> <p><b><i>No sweatshirts including pullover hoodies or zip up hoodies are allowed on campus and may not be worn as a coat/jacket to school except for approved styles on Casual Thursdays for Rhetoric students only (see Casual Thursday Dress Code)</i></b></p>
<p>*All clothing and accessories should be clean, properly fitting, and without major stains or holes.</p>
